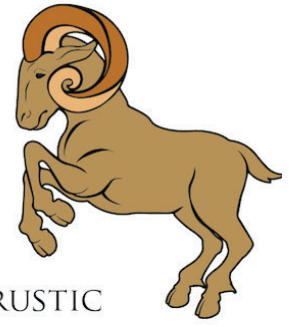
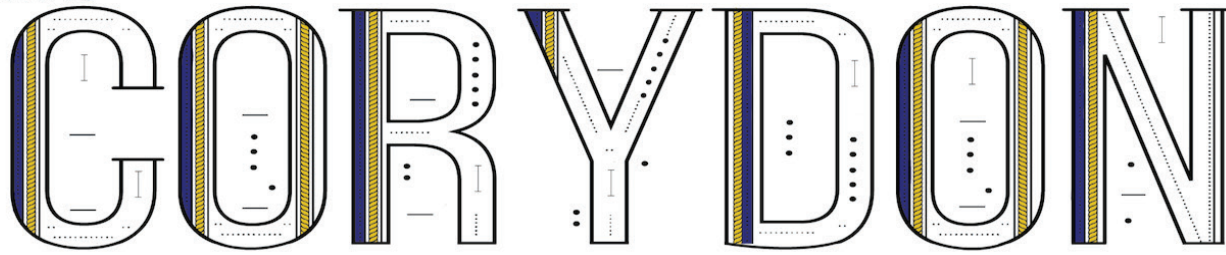
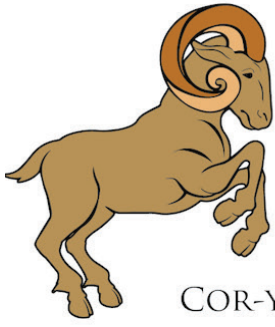

## Millikan Discontinues Pathways

Since the closing of Millikan's GREEN pathway in the 2018-19 school year, LBUUSD and Millikan administration unanimously decided to discontinue Small-Learning Communities (SLCs). This means that starting the 2019-20 school year, all Millikan students will study under a single curriculum rather than SLC-specific programs. There were two motives behind the district's decision. The first was to put an end to "SLC stereotypes," overgeneralized beliefs about students based on the SLC they're in. MBA students are not Wall Street businessmen, and

MIT students are not technology Einsteins. Not all COMPASS students plan to major in art, and not every QUEST student spends 20 hours studying every day. The second motive was to push students in creating a challenging and rigorous schedule. To resolve this academic disbalance, the district modified certain requirements that will apply to the student body. All students will be required to take at least six Advanced Placement classes and complete 60 hours of community service before graduation. This unexpected decision received mixed responses from both students and staff. "It's a great thing that

we won't be in SLCs anymore," says an anonymous student. "I can have some of my core classes like English and history with my friends who I previously couldn't have a class with because of my SLC." However, not everyone was excited about the discontinuation of the pathways. "Wait, we have to take AP classes now?" one student asked. "I'm going to be a senior next year and I've only taken one [AP] in the entirety of my high school career!" "It's a pathway to absolute oblivion!" said an anonymous English teacher. "It is a terrible path to confusion and chaos. I'm appalled at this horrific decision by the district."

Have you seen a pigeon since the government shut down? Neither have we.

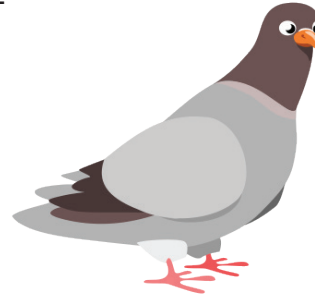
A man in Wyoming recently found a pigeon lying in his front yard. He presumed the pigeon was dead but upon further examina-

The idea for a 'Bring your Pet to School' day was inspired by several colleges that installed a 'puppy play room' so students may de-brief after stressful weeks.

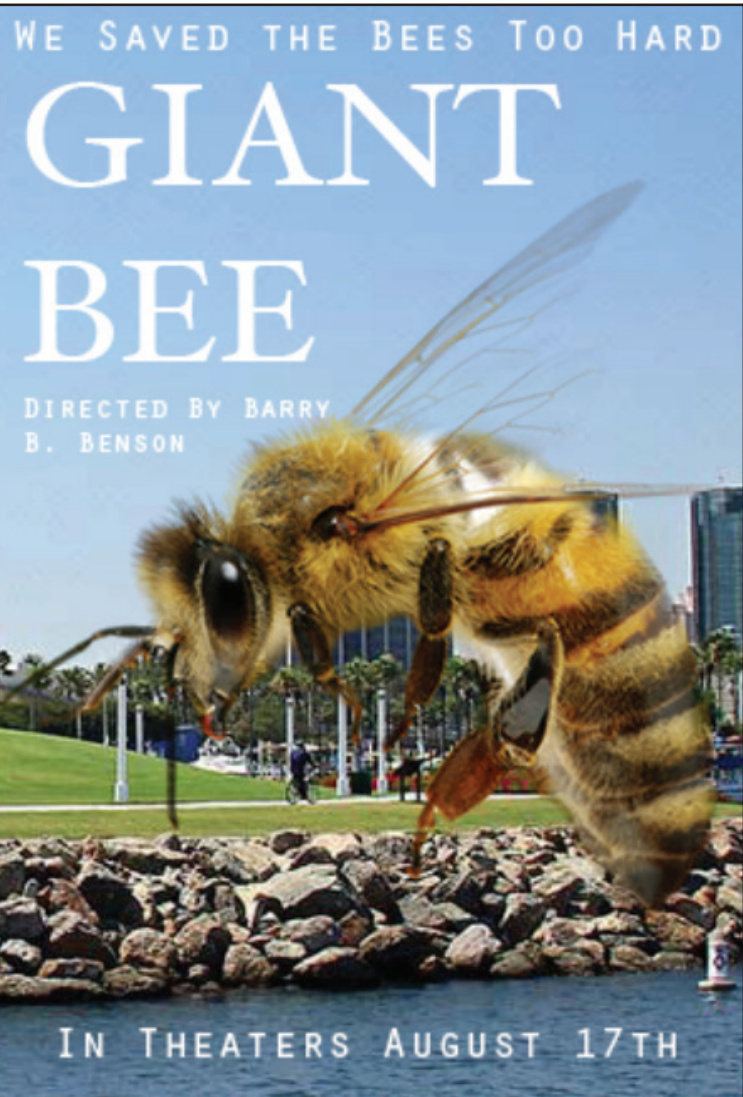
This will be a one time event to determine if the school should implement this 'holiday' next year.

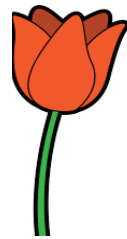
"Of course, she had three martinis before that, so whether any of it actually happened is anyone's guess," Soar concludes.

See? There's always a way to make the most of your time with your nagging family.

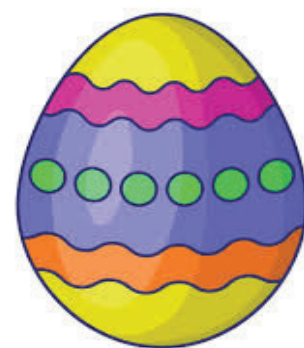

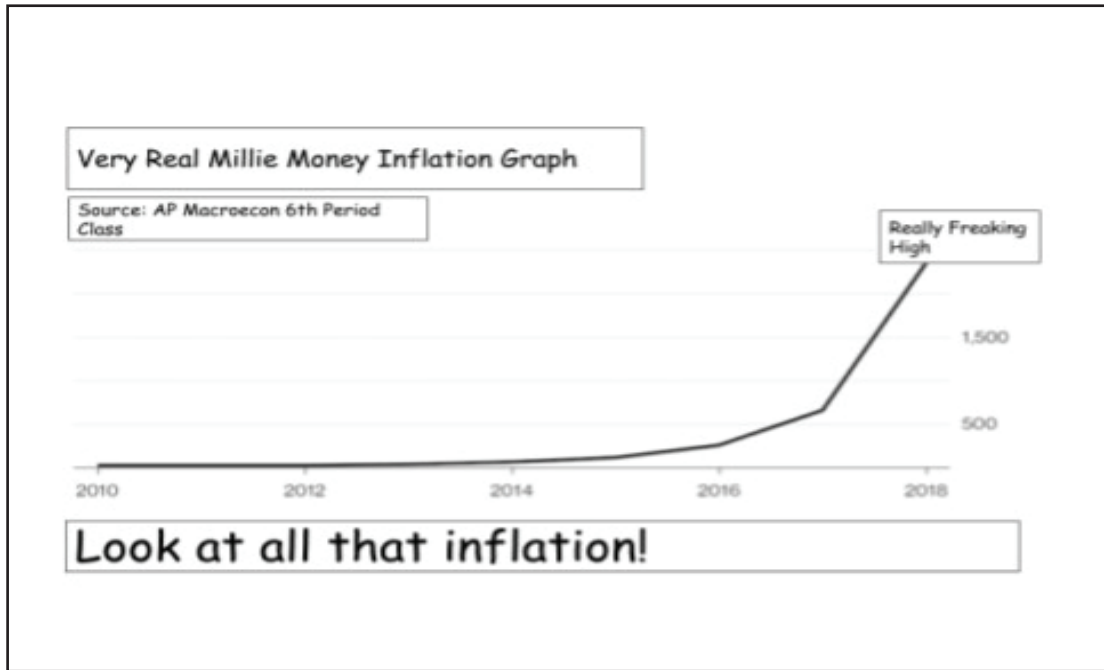

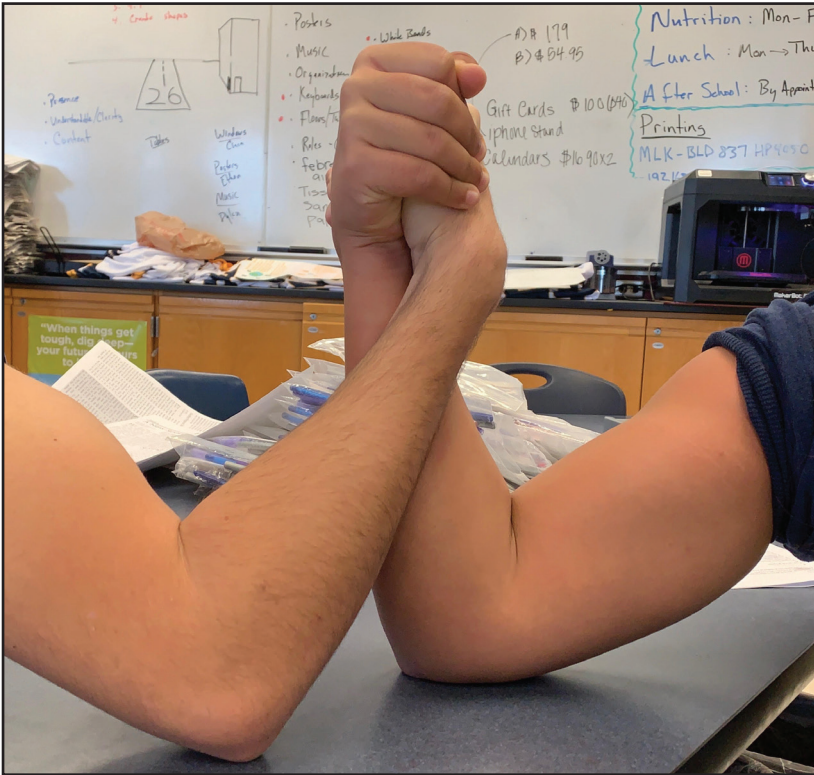
Next they took on their next meet at Flavortown High School, where John Cena High made a return.
