Cruz will attend UC Riverside this fall.

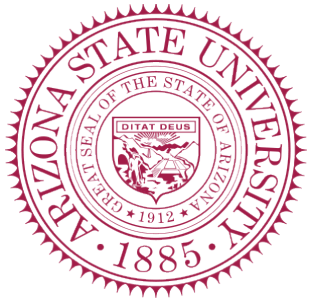
Andrea Bautista says, "I feel proud for having been in COMPASS because it makes Millikan fun and gives opportunities for self expression." She will be attending college at CSULB.
